Throughout the Old Testament we see an interesting thing that the Israelites do every time God provided in a special way, gave them a victory in battle, met a big need... etc. The would build an altar in remembrance of that act of God. They did that so they would remember! They did that so that when hard times came, and God seemed quiet, far off or slow to move they could have a physical reminder of all the times He'd come through for them... and their trust in Him was built! They were reminded when tempted to doubt that God had been trustworthy in the past and they could trust Him again.
